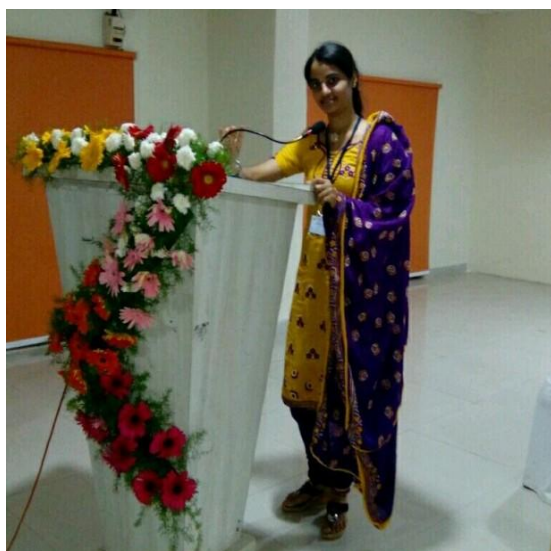
The conference provided a good platform for the research scholars to interact and share their knowledge with the fellow community. The student community was benefitted by receiving inputs about the prospective research problems.
