It was indeed an intriguing session for the first year students as the speaker, Mr.Nagaprasad from Karnataka spoke so genuinely about his struggles and how he had seeked the wrong ways to pass in his exams; however he realised that there were no short cuts to succeed; he worked very hard to achieve his goals.

Naga Prasad soared beyond numerous obstacles, aiming to achieve significant milestones. In January 2001, he set a national record by crafting and launching 505 paper rockets within 60 minutes. Shortly after, in May 2002, he achieved a world record by typing continuously for 35 hours and 45 minutes on a personal computer, transcribing the holy books including the Quran, Bible, and Bhagwad Gita. His experiences of pain, distrust, and failure were transformed into a driving force behind his record-breaking accomplishments.
